# Mission Statement

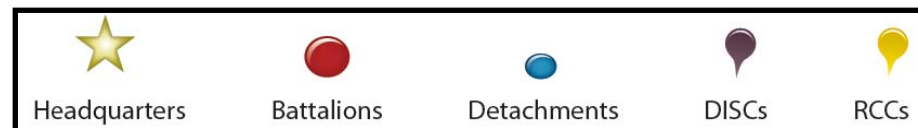
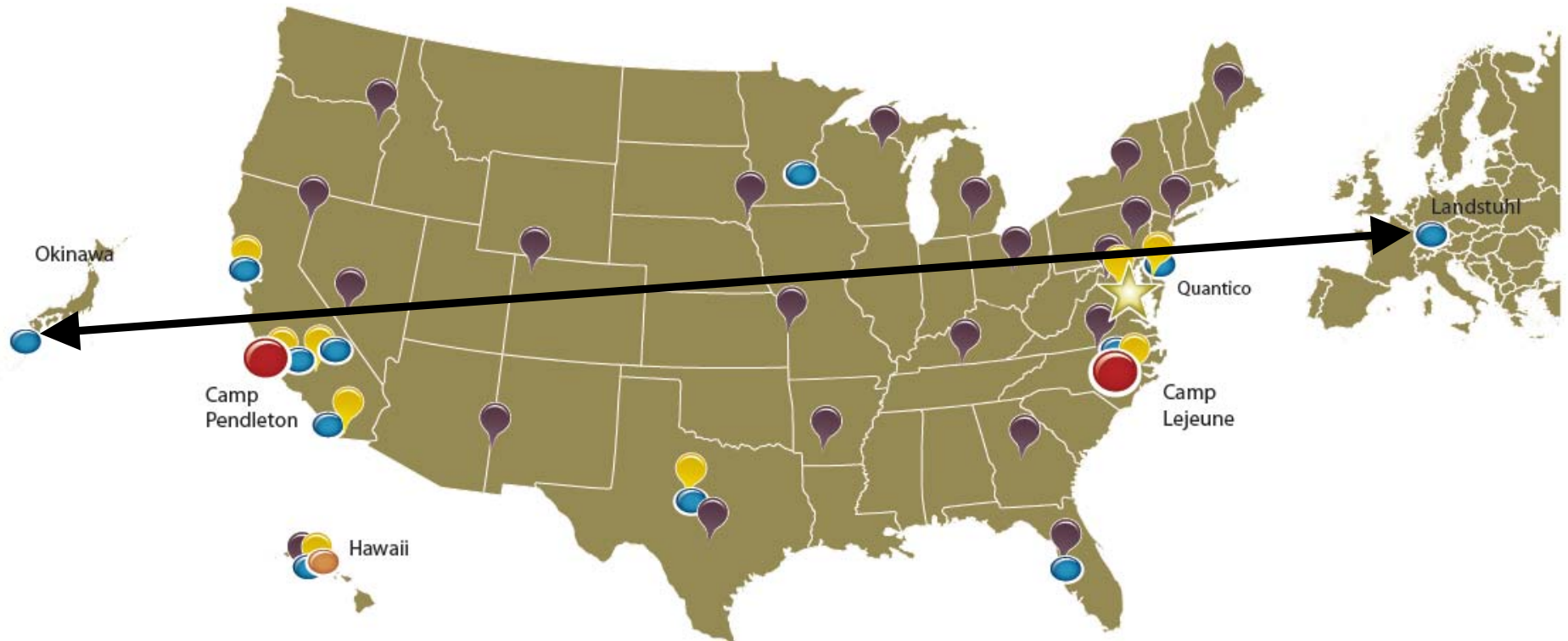
